What are Apprenticeships?

As an Apprentice you will work alongside experienced staff, in a real job, to develop the skills you need to accelerate, and advance your career. Apprenticeships are unique in that they allow you to both learn and earn at the same time.

You will be supported throughout your Apprenticeship by your personal Trainer Coach who will give you the one to one support you need to succeed.

Whatever stage you're at in your career, whether you've just left school, haven't got the qualifications you wanted, or have graduated with a degree there's an Apprenticeship for you.

Employers respect and value apprentices as they're able to demonstrate real life experience and skills that can immediately improve business performance. Doing an Apprenticeship can open doors for you – you'll get sector-specific experience, get your name heard and add real value to your CV.



What levels are there?

At Educ8 Group, we offer apprenticeships across a wide range of subjects at three levels.

Name	Level	Equivalent educational level
Foundation	2	5 GCSE passes at grade A*-C or 9-4
Apprenticeship	3	2 A Level passes / Level 3 Diploma / International Baccalaureate
Higher Apprenticeship	4 & 5	Foundation degree and above

How much will I earn?

The national minimum wage (NMW) for apprentices is £4.30 per hour from April 2021. However, this will vary according to your age, your role, and the sector you will be working in. Many employers do pay more than the minimum wage and will increase to salaries as you progress on your Apprenticeship

The apprentice rate applies to apprentices aged under 19, or aged 19 and over and in the first year of their Apprenticeship. Apprentices are entitled to the minimum wage for their age once they are both over the age of 19 and have completed the first year of their apprenticeship

Communication/interpersonal skills

Good communication in a work setting is vital for establishing professional relationships. Learning how to listen carefully and to share information effectively, both verbally and in writing, are important skills that employers look for.

Organisational skills

Balancing a real job with study will teach you valuable organisational skills, including good time management and how to keep on top of paperwork.

Teamwork

Throughout our careers we will have to work with others to get things done. Developing the ability to work well in a team by acquiring good listening skills, learning when to hold back and when to take charge, and

contributing your fair share of the work will stand you in good stead.

Problem-solving

You need to persevere and be resilient when trying to solve a problem. Sometimes you might stumble across more issues along the way. But failing first time will only help you learn and improve, so just keep trying until you get it right.

Adaptability

Learning how to cope with changing situations that may sometimes take you out of your comfort zone will help you to succeed in the modern world of work, where things can change rapidly!

Commitment

The successful completion of an Apprenticeship Programme is not possible without your full commitment to the programme. It is also essential for you to work closely with both your training provider and employer to achieve your Apprenticeship.

As an apprentice, you need to:

Be prepared to commit to both work and study. At least 20% of your time will be spent studying and 80% working, which can lead to competing demands on your time. As such, you will need to...

Be well-organised, learn how to prioritise tasks and keep on top of your workload in order to succeed on your Apprenticeship.

Commit to your Apprenticeship Programme by making sure you attend all off-the-job workshops and training and complete all

assignments and assessments on time. Essential Skills. Learners will need to complete their Level 2 Essential Skills qualifications in Application of Number, Digital Literacy and Communication, unless they can evidence prior achievement.
